



## Notice to Players Addendum CADDIES / MOTORIZED GOLF CARTS

### UTAH Jr. Tour

Caddies or the use of a motorized golf cart are not allowed at UJGA sanctioned events except that caddies are allowed for the U.S. Junior Amateur, U.S. Girls Junior qualifying tournaments and carts are allowed for the Challenge Cup Matches. (NOTE: If a caddie is employed at a USGA event they must meet the USGA's caddie requirements as indicated on the USGA tournament entry form).

### SWIRE COCA-COLA Jr. Tour

The UJGA has adopted the policy of “**requiring**” Caddies for the Boys 7-8 and Girls 10 & Under divisions and “**allowing**” for the Boys 9-10 and Girls 11-12 divisions. All caddies must follow the UJGA Code of Conduct rules, this to include the UJGA Dress Code.

Caddie requirements:

- Caddie must be at least 14 years of age and a family member (parent, guardian, sibling, grandparent, aunt, uncle or cousin).
- Caddies must attend the UJGA Rules of Golf Workshop.
- Inappropriate conduct will result in the immediate revoking of a Caddies privileges as defined in the Rules of Golf (*Definition: Rule 6-4 USGA Rules of Golf*)
- A person may caddie for more than one player in a group, however both players must be related to the caddie (see relationship requirement above). In this situation the caddie must advise the other players / parents in the group that he will be assisting both players.

As provided in the Rules of the Golf and UJGA policies, the following are things that a caddie is not allowed to:

- Stand behind the player as an extension of the line of play while the player is putting or playing a stroke through the green.
- Walk-on or touch or test the surface of a putting green or hazard.
- Prevent a ball from traveling its original path or placement (Rule 1-2)
- Give advice to other players unless you are also caddying for them.
